
GeM – A Case Study of Successful Implementation

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About ONGC





- ONGC a Central Public Sector Enterprise engaged in exploration and drilling for oil
- Requires very high investments and great technical expertise
- Annual procurement approx. Rs.35,000 crores
- 38,000 active participants in the supply chain



GeM – Govt. e-Marketplace



- A National Public Procurement portal on the lines of ecommerce websites
- B2B marketplace for procurement of common use Goods & Services
- Already achieved Rs.22,000 crore of Gross Market Value
- ❖ A base of more than 2 lac sellers and service providers
- Offers over 8 lakh products and services
- An opportunity for the private sector to connect with Govt. procurement



GeM – A Disruptive Procurement Process



- Disruptive technologies like block-chain & artificial intelligence have the potential to change procurement
- GeM is a Made in India disruptive procurement process
- Enables addition of an item to cart and next-day delivery



Implementation of GeM - Challenges



- GeM is an ERP system with end-to-end procurement processes
- GeM Based on General Financial Rules of the Govt. of India
- Terms and conditions and software designed on a one-size-fits-all approach
- PSUs have large degrees of autonomy
- Materials Management policies and Financial Delegation of Powers differ vastly
- ONGC has its own ERP
- e-procurement system handles all tenders above Rs. 5 lacs (> 90% of all tenders)
- Processes to be completed in own ERP to ensure integrity of material and financial accounting

We shall overcome



- A typical ONGC tender runs into 150 pages compared to some 33 pages of GeM
 - ONGC adopted all terms and conditions of GeM
- GeM determines and displays L-1 bidder
 - Preparation and vetting of comparative statement done away with
- No system of clarifications and commercial conditions of GeM are accepted by the seller
 - Tender Committee done away with
- Security Deposit for orders upto Rs. 30 lacs waived off
- Adopted GeM's incident management system for dealing with defaulters
 - ONGC's banning process not adopted for GeM orders
- Indentors asked to match specifications with the products available on GeM


